## **INTRODUCTION**

*Though the word trinity is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.*

**FIRST READING**

**Genesis 1:1-2:4a**

*This first creation story reached its current form during the crisis of the Babylonian exile of the people of Israel. God, not their captors' god Marduk, was responsible for their existence. God created women and men as rulers over creation, to preserve and protect it. God also rested on the seventh day, hallowing that day forever as the Sabbath.*

<sup>1</sup>In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, <sup>2</sup>the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. <sup>3</sup>Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. <sup>4</sup>And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. <sup>5</sup>God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

<sup>6</sup>And God said, “Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.” <sup>7</sup>So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. <sup>8</sup>God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

<sup>9</sup>And God said, “Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.” And it was so. <sup>10</sup>God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. <sup>11</sup>Then God said, “Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.” And it was so. <sup>12</sup>The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. <sup>13</sup>And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

<sup>14</sup>And God said, “Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, <sup>15</sup>and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.” And it was so. <sup>16</sup>God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. <sup>17</sup>God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, <sup>18</sup>to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. <sup>19</sup>And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

<sup>20</sup>And God said, “Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.” <sup>21</sup>So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. <sup>22</sup>God blessed them, saying, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.” <sup>23</sup>And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

<sup>24</sup>And God said, “Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.” And it was so. <sup>25</sup>God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

<sup>26</sup>Then God said, “Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.”

<sup>27</sup>So God created humankind in his image,  
in the image of God he created them;  
male and female he created them.

<sup>28</sup>God blessed them, and God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.” <sup>29</sup>God said, “See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. <sup>30</sup>And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food.” And it was so. <sup>31</sup>God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

<sup>2:1</sup>Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. <sup>2</sup>And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. <sup>3</sup>So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested

from all the work that he had done in creation.

<sup>4a</sup>These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

### **Reflection**

*This is the first story in the Bible. What was there before “the beginning”? (verse 1) What do you think is meant by “in the beginning”? Remember that wind, breath, and spirit are the same word in both Hebrew and Greek. (Genesis was written down in Hebrew.) Who was there before “the beginning”? (verses 1-2) What did God create first? (verse 3) How did God create? (verse 3—also verses 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, 26) As you read this text carefully, what do you notice about the order of creation? What is God’s evaluation of the creation? Does “good” mean “perfect”? What do you think “good” means in this text? In verses 6-8, God creates a “dome” that God called Sky. The picture here is of a solid, curved sky held up by pillars over a flat earth, providing space between waters above (where rain and snow come from) and waters under (the sea, rivers, lakes, and so forth). This is not how we understand the sky and the waters (which were created after the sky in this story—see verses 9-10). Does this mean this story is not “true”? Why or why not? In the organization of light, God creates “two great lights” that rule the day and the night. What do you think this means in the context of this text? What is the blessing that God gives the birds, the fish, and the swarms of creatures that live in the sea? (verses 20-22) How are the animals created? (Read carefully verse 24) How were human beings created? (verses 26-27) What blessing does God give to humankind? (verses 28-29) What do you think it means for humans to have “dominion” over every living thing? How are humans to exercise dominion? What happens on the seventh day? (2:1-3) If you have read this text before, what do you learn from reading it/hearing it again? If you have not read or heard this text before, what have you learned about God and creation from reading it?*

### **Reflection**

*This psalm is another view of creation (although influenced by the story in Genesis 1). What does the psalmist see when looking at the creation? (verses 1-3) What question does the whole creation prompt in the psalmist? (verse 4) What does the psalmist learn about human beings from reflecting on the creation? (verses 5-8) What do you think it means when the psalmist describes what God has done by “put[ting] all things under their feet”? Who is deserving of praise for the creation? (verse 9) What do you learn about creation and God from reading and praying this psalm?*

### **SECOND READING**

### **2 Corinthians 13:11-13**

*Paul closes a challenging letter to the Corinthians with an appeal to Christian fellowship grounded in the triune harmony of Christ’s grace, God’s love, the Spirit’s partnership.*

[Paul writes:] <sup>11</sup>Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. <sup>12</sup>Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you.

<sup>13</sup>The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

### **Reflection**

Because of God’s great love for us, how does Paul encourage us (and the Corinthians) to live? (verses 11-12) Where have you heard verse 13 before? How does this verse sum up Paul’s understanding of the nature of God and the nature of Christian community? Does it describe our understanding of God and of our assembly?

### **\*GOSPEL**

### **Matthew 28:16-20**

*After his resurrection, Jesus summons his remaining disciples and commissions them to baptize and teach all nations in the name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.*

<sup>16</sup>Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup>When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup>And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup>Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup>and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

### **Reflection**

*Where does this text take place? (verse 16) Remember why there are only eleven disciples? (See Matthew 27:3-10) What is the response of the disciples to seeing Jesus? (verse 17) Why do you think some doubted? Does this surprise you? What do you think they doubted? Do you ever doubt? If your answer is yes, I think this puts you in good company! What do you think? What does Jesus say about his authority? (verse 18) Do you think this means he did not have authority before this moment? (See Matthew 7:28 and the chapters following, especially 8:1-4, 8-9, 14-16, 27, 29-32, 9:2-8, 9-13, 18-26; 21:23-32) What does it mean for us that Jesus has been given all authority in heaven and on earth?*

What are we called to do as Jesus' disciples? (verses 19-20) Do we do anything on our own authority?  
Where is Jesus now? (verse 20)

**Whoever wants to be saved  
should above all cling to the catholic faith.  
Whoever does not guard it whole and inviolable

neither confusing the persons  
nor dividing the divine being.  
For the Father is one person,

But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit

coeternal in majesty.  
What the Father is,  
the Son is,  
and so is the Holy Spirit.**

**Uncreated is the Father;  
uncreated is the Son;  
uncreated is the Spirit.  
The Father is infinite;  
the Son is infinite;  
the Holy Spirit is infinite.  
Eternal is the Father;  
eternal is the Son;  
eternal is the Spirit:  
And yet there are not three eternal beings,  
but one who is eternal;  
as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings,  
but one who is uncreated and unlimited.  
Almighty is the Father;  
almighty is the Son;  
almighty is the Spirit:  
And yet there are not three almighty beings,  
but one who is almighty.**

**Thus the Father is God;  
the Son is God;  
the Holy Spirit is God:  
And yet there are not three gods,  
but one God.**

**Thus the Father is Lord;  
the Son is Lord;  
the Holy Spirit is Lord:  
And yet there are not three lords,  
but one Lord.**

**As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge  
each distinct person as God and Lord,  
so catholic religion forbids us  
to say that there are three gods or lords.**

**The Father was neither made**

**nor created nor begotten;  
the Son was neither made nor created,  
but was alone begotten of the Father;  
the Spirit was neither made nor created,  
but is proceeding from the Father and the Son.  
Thus there is one Father, not three fathers;  
one Son, not three sons;  
one Holy Spirit, not three spirits.**

**And in this Trinity, no one is before or after,  
greater or less than the other;  
but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal;  
and so we must worship the Trinity in unity  
and the one God in three persons.**

**Whoever wants to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.**

**It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe  
that our Lord Jesus became flesh.**

**For this is the true faith that we believe and confess:  
That our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son,  
is both God and man.**

**He is God, begotten before all worlds  
from the being of the Father,  
and he is man, born in the world  
from the being of his mother—  
existing fully as God,  
and fully as man  
with a rational soul and a human body;  
equal to the Father in divinity,  
subordinate to the Father in humanity.**

**Although he is God and man,  
he is not divided,  
but is one Christ.**

**He is united because God  
has taken humanity into himself;  
he does not transform deity into humanity.  
He is completely one in the unity of his person,  
without confusing his natures.**

**For as the rational soul and body are one person,  
so the one Christ is God and man.**

**He suffered death for our salvation.  
He descended into hell  
and rose again from the dead.  
He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

**At his coming all people shall rise bodily  
to give an account of their own deeds.  
Those who have done good will enter eternal life,  
those who have done evil will enter eternal fire.**

**This is the catholic faith.  
One cannot be saved  
without believing this firmly and faithfully.**
