## Sunday, June 4, 2017 Day of Pentecost

#### INTRODUCTION

Today's festival derives its name from the Jewish festival of Pentecost, observed fifty days after Passover. On the fiftieth day of Easter we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us that heals, forgives, inspires, and unites. In the reading from Acts, images of wind and fire describe the Spirit poured out on disciples of all nations. In John's gospel the risen Christ breathes the Spirit on his followers on Easter evening. In the one Spirit we are baptized into one body, and at the Lord's table the Spirit unites us for witness in the world.

FIRST READING Numbers 11:24-30

The Spirit of God rested upon seventy elders in Israel who had been chosen to share the burden of leadership with Moses. When some became jealous that two others also had the spirit and could prophesy, Moses said that he hoped that all of God's people would be prophets.

<sup>24</sup>Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. <sup>25</sup>Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again.

<sup>26</sup>Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. <sup>27</sup>And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." <sup>28</sup>And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, said, "My lord Moses, stop them!" <sup>29</sup>But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD's people were prophets, and that the LORD would put his spirit on them!" <sup>30</sup>And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

## Reflection

This text comes in the context of the people of Israel complaining to Moses that he isn't doing enough for them, and Moses complains to the Lord that he is carrying too heavy a burden. (Read Numbers 11:1-23) What is God's response? (verses 24-25, see Numbers 15:16-17) What happened outside the tent of meeting? (verse 26) What was the response of the young man and Joshua, Moses' assistant? (verses 27-28) What did Moses think of all these other people having the Spirit of the Lord? (verses 29-30) What happens when we expect one person (or even a small group of people) to lead us all the time? One of the things that is true of our congregation is that a lot of people do a lot of different things in ministry. What happens to the work of the Lord when we work like that? What if we expected one person (say, our pastor) to do all that work? Who among us has the Spirit of the Lord? (Hint: look around!)

#### Reflection

"Manifold" means "many and varied." (I looked it up in our big American Heritage Dictionary.) How does the psalmist illustrate the manifold—many and varied—works of the Lord? (verses 24-26) What if there were only one kind of creature in creation? Think of as many different (many and varied) creatures you see on a daily basis—or even that are with you, even if you don't see them. Science is a great help as we reflect on this! Elizabeth did her graduate research on proteins—and they were many and varied! What do all the manifold works of the Lord have in common? (verses 27-30) What does the Lord think of the manifold works of creation? (verses 31-32) Think of the manifold ways in which these creatures "sing to the Lord!" (verses 33-34, 35b) How will you join in the celebration of the Lord on this Day of Pentecost?

SECOND READING Acts 2:1-21

Pentecost was a Jewish harvest festival that marked the fiftieth day after Passover. Luke portrays the Holy Spirit being poured out upon the disciples before the gathered and astonished people assembled in Jerusalem for the festival. Filled with the Spirit, the disciples were able to witness to the power of Christ's resurrection.

<sup>1</sup>When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sup>4</sup>All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

<sup>5</sup>Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup>And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. <sup>7</sup>Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup>And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? <sup>9</sup>Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup>Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, <sup>11</sup>Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." <sup>12</sup>All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another,

"What does this mean?" 13But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

<sup>14</sup>But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. <sup>15</sup>Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. <sup>16</sup>No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions,
and your old men shall dream dreams.

18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women,
in those days I will pour out my Spirit;
and they shall prophesy.

19 And I will show portents in the heaven above
and signs on the earth below,
blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

20 The sun shall be turned to darkness
and the moon to blood,
before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

21 Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

#### Reflection

Who is gathered together in one place on Pentecost? (verse 1—see Acts 1) What happens to them? (verses 2-4) What is one of the "manifold" gifts of Pentecost? (verse 4) Who else (a manifold number) is in Jerusalem on Pentecost? (verse 5) What happened to the apostles was not a quiet thing! What do these others hear? (verses 5-11) What gift did these other people receive on Pentecost? (verse 8) What do they all want to know? (verse 12) What is one explanation? (not the right one!) (verse 13) I'm convinced that the gift of the Holy Spirit was not so much in the speaking as in the hearing—because they all understood Peter! (verses 14-21) What does Peter tell them? (This is the beginning of his sermon.) What might it mean for us as an assembly of many and varied people if we understood that the gift of the Holy Spirit is a listening mind and heart? What might we hear from one another? What have you heard in the last few months that has convinced you that you have the gift of hearing given by the Holy Spirit?

\*GOSPEL John 7:37-39

Jesus describes the Holy Spirit as living water, quenching the thirst of all who come to him and filling the hearts of believers till they overflow.

<sup>37</sup>On the last day of the festival [of Booths], the great day, while Jesus was standing [in the temple], he cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, <sup>38</sup>and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living

water." <sup>39</sup>Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

## Reflection

In order to get the context of this text, you may want to read all of chapter 7. This is the Festival of Booths, which Jesus went to secretly (John 7:10) because "the Jews [the leaders] were looking for him" ... "to kill [him]." (John 7:19, 25, 32) What did Jesus proclaim at this Festival? (verses 37-38) What happens when we receive the Spirit of Jesus? (verse 38) When did the Spirit come into the lives of the followers of Jesus? (verse 39) What does it mean to you that Jesus has told us that "out of the believer's heart (that is, our hearts!) shall flow rivers of living water"? What is this living water? Where do we, as believers, get it from? When were you brought through the water? What does our baptism have to do with Pentecost?
