INTRODUCTION

The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we play in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. Today we gather with the disciples on the first Easter, and Jesus breathes the Spirit on us. With Thomas we ask for a sign, and Jesus offers us his wounded self in the broken bread. From frightened individuals we are transformed into a community of open doors, peace, forgiveness, and material sharing such that no one among us is in need.

FIRST READING Acts 4:32-35

While the apostles testified to others about the resurrection of Jesus, the early Christian community shared what they owned or sold their possessions to help their fellow believers who were in need.

³²Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. ³³With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. ³⁴There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. ³⁵They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

Reflection

How does Luke (the author of Acts) describe the spiritual life of the early Christian community? (verse 32) How does he describe the economic life of that community? (verses 32, 34-35) What do you think the relationship is between spirituality or faith and economics? This whole way of life is described as a result of the resurrection faith. How does Luke account for it? (verse 33) Have you ever thought about how what you believe about the/your economy and your finances are related to your faith in Jesus Christ? How does your faith affect how you live with your money? (I'm certainly not talking about just what you give to the church!) In what ways might the daily life of the first Christian community be a model for us?

Reflection

This psalm about the unity of God's people is called "an instructional psalm." Verse 1 reminds me of Philippians 2:1-5, and certainly Acts 4:32. What is the unity that we have with all our sisters and brothers in Christ? How does the psalmist describe it? (verse 2) The notes in the Lutheran Bible remind us that a way of showing hospitality and welcome in Israel was by anointing their head with oil (as in Psalm 23:5). Anointing the head of a priest like Aaron was to set that person aside as one who blesses others. What is the significance of dew "flowing down upon the hills of Zion" in a desert climate? How does the psalmist name the blessing that comes from the Lord? (verse 3)

SECOND READING 1 John 1:1--2:2

The opening of this letter serves as a reality check. The reality of God is light, but our confessed reality has been sin. God cleanses us from our sinful reality through Christ's death so that we live in fellowship with Christ and walk in God's light.

¹We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—²this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us—³we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

⁵This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; ⁷but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

^{2:1}My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; ²and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

Reflection

What has been revealed "from the beginning"? (verses 1-4) How can the writer of 1 John reveal this? (verse 1) Notice "heard," "seen," "touched." Is this academic knowledge or experience knowledge? What is the result of this testimony? (verses 3-4) How do we know the difference between what is a lie and what is truth? (verse 6) In the same way, how do we know that someone is speaking in faith from what they know of God? (verse 5) How will we know if we are walking in the light of Jesus? (verse 7) What is the result for us of walking in the light of Jesus? (verses 8-9) Does being in this fellowship with one another in the light of Christ mean that we will never sin? (verse 10) What happens when we do sin? (2:1-2) Do you sense a

theme here in the lectionary? Where does our unity/fellowship/kindredship in Christ come from? In what ways do we live in this unity/fellowship in our community? Certainly not in our opinions, likes, dislikes.... How are we united in Christ?

As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²²When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you

Reflection

What happens on Easter evening? (verse 19) What does Jesus say? Do you think the disciples might have been afraid? How does Jesus show them it is he himself? (verse 20) He has a job for them. What is that work? (verse 21) How does he expect them to do what he has commanded? (verses 22-23) What does the resurrection of Jesus have to do with the forgiveness of sins? Thomas was missing from that first gathering. How does he respond to the other disciples talking about Jesus' appearance among them? (verses 24-25) How does Jesus appear to Thomas? (verses 26-27) What is Thomas's response? (verse 28) Thomas is one of my heroes in the Bible. He asks questions! And when he sees Jesus, his response (verse 28) is the climax of John's gospel. Why was John's gospel written? (verses 30-31) For some people, the Bible is a moral guidebook. (I'm not sure they have read it!) What is it for the community of faith? (verse 31) This passage is a suggestion about how to read the Bible—not so much as a guide for living, but as a way of a life of faith. What do you think?
